Regarding Artwork Viewing :

- Please avoid loud voices or causing any inconvenience in residential areas.

Regarding Travel and Transportation :

- Make sure to wear comfortable shoes and clothing for walking!
- Free Triennale shuttle buses operate between JR Uno station and Tai area.
- Ride bicycles safely. Avoid speeding, riding while looking at your phone, or one-handed operation like holding your hat.
- For those driving to the Uno Port area, please use nearby paid parking lots. Note that there are no specific parking spaces for individual artworks.
- Please travel without bicycle to Uno17, since the alleys are narrow without bicycle parking.

For heatstroke prevention :

- Make sure to look up resting spots in advance, take breaks early, use a sunshade or hat for heat protection, and stay hydrated frequently!

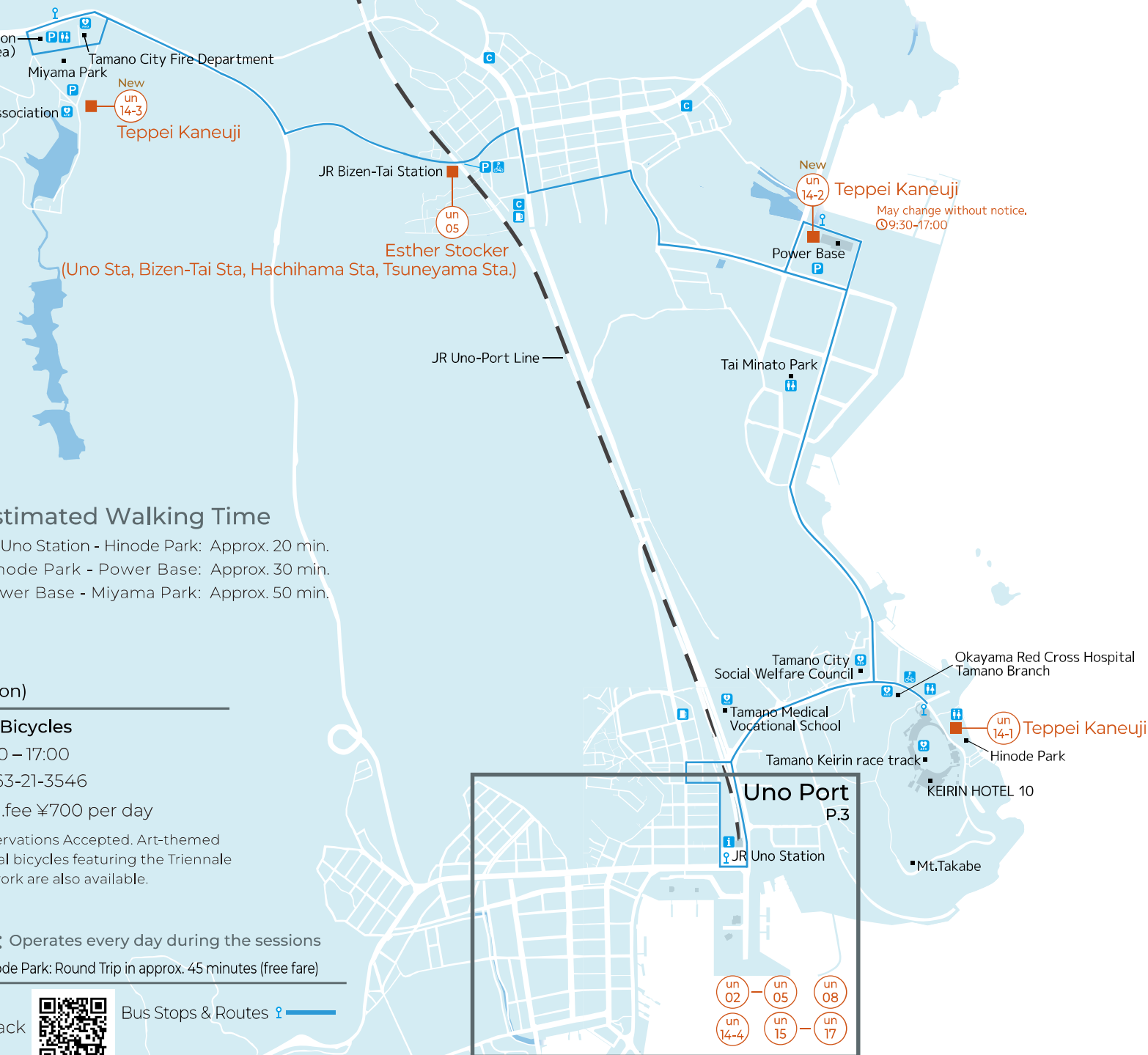

Exploring Tamano

Tamano City is located at the southern tip of Okayama Prefecture, a picturesque port town blessed with the beautiful nature of the Seto Inland Sea, and a mild climate.



Shibukawa Beach

A stunning coastline of white sand and green pine trees stretches approximately 1 kilometer. Recognized as one of Japan's Top 100 Beaches and Top 100 Best Beaches, it stands out as the largest beach in Okayama. Perfect for a refreshing walk, and a 20-minute drive from Uno Port.



Shibukawa Marine Aquarium

A unique aquarium that includes a museum. The aquarium focuses on sea creatures from the Seto Inland Sea, but includes those from all over Japan. The museum offers a treasure trove of information where one can learn about nature and cultural phenomena. About a 20-minute drive from Uno Port, right next to Shibukawa Beach.



Mt. Ojigatake

Mt. Ojigatake is a designated part of Seto Inland Sea National Park. Its dramatic views feature massive and unique rock formations. From the 234-meter summit, you can enjoy breathtaking panoramas of the Seto Inland Sea's islands, the entirety of the Seto Ohashi Bridge, and the distant mountains of Shikoku. Seasonal blooms like cherry blossoms and azaleas add to its charm, making it perfect for hiking and relaxation. About a 25-minute drive from Uno Port.



Tama Shopping Street & Tamahime Shrine

At Tama Shopping Street, you'll find nostalgic Showa-era charm in its delightful streets. Nearby is Tamahime Shrine, home to a large rock called Tateishi that graces its grounds. You can explore around from by renting a bicycle. About 15 minutes by bicycle, or 8-minute drive from Uno Port.

Miyama Park

A vast park embracing nature across 200 hectares offers around 7,000 cherry blossom trees, along with a dazzling variety of 300 species and 150,000 trees including plums, camellias, azaleas, and maples. Each season brings beauty of nature. About a 10-minute drive from Uno Port.

Power Base

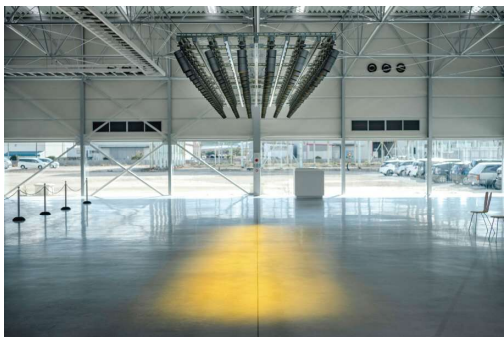


Designed by Kazuyo Sejima, this facility is the largest battery manufacturing factory in the country. It produces large-scale battery systems essential for the stable supply of renewable energy. During the event sessions, visitors can join factory tours or enjoy a pop-up cafe by BOLLARD COFFEE at Uno Port. Light snacks are also available, which are made in collaboration with the renowned Tokyo restaurant Aoyagi.

Access to factory tours, the cafe, or restrooms requires pre-registration for factory admission tickets.



SETOUCHI ART & INDUSTRY



In 2026, the Setouchi Industrial Art Festival will showcase the theme of Industry x Art. The factory will be reimagined as a museum, expressing the wisdom and philosophies of manufacturing as artistic creations, and inspiring new discoveries.

SHIMA SHIMA



These benches are inspired by islands floating in the Seto Inland Sea.

Uno Port where many ships arrive and depart for islands in the Seto Inland Sea is the gateway to the sea and the venue for the art festival. Here we created the "Island of Beginnings", the first stop for people traveling from island to island. We hope that people can experience time more slowly at Uno Port enjoy the art the sea and the nature of the Seto Inland Sea.

The former Yamada Branch of the Salt Control Bureau Ajino Storage Office and its adjoining library



In the Yamada district in the eastern part of Tamano City, salt fields once flourished as one of the nation's prominent salt production hubs. Under the Salt Control System, a wooden office building constructed in March of 1908 by the former Ministry of Finance was called the Yamada Branch of the Ajino Storage Office. Additionally, the brick library housed official documents related to the Salt Control. Today, it is incredibly rare to find both the office building and library preserved together, making this facility an invaluable cultural asset.
